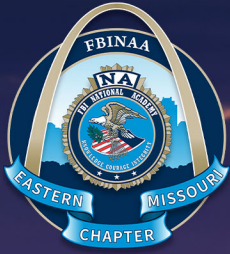

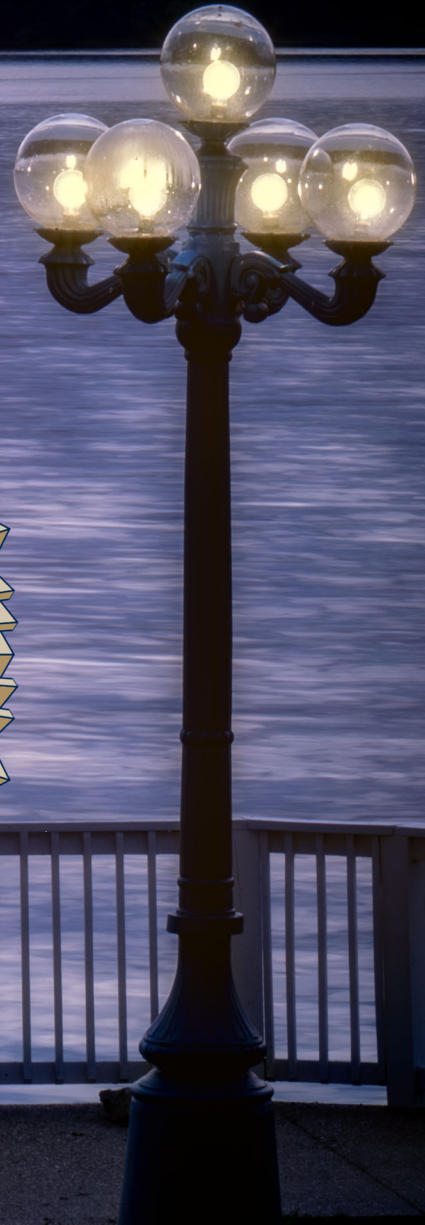

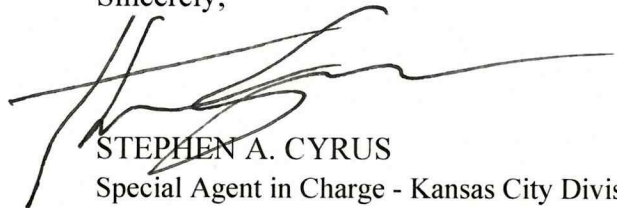

2025 Presenters

Greg Birch

Lieutenant, Deputy Sheriff, Osage County Missouri Sheriff's Office
Command Sergeant Major, U.S. Army (retired)

Greg Birch graduated first in his class from the University of Missouri Law Enforcement Training Institute in April 2019 at age 60. He currently works as a reserve Deputy Sheriff in Osage County Missouri and a part time deputy in Oakland County Michigan. He still works as a consultant for private sector businesses and non-profits. He graduated Summa Cum Laude from the University of Central Missouri in 2022 with a BS in Crisis and Disaster Management.

Between military retirement and beginning his law enforcement career, Mr. Birch worked as a security consultant in high threat environments conducting vulnerability assessments, counter-surveillance and working as personal protection specialist. He has also trained military special operations and law enforcement personnel in rifle and pistol marksmanship, long range precision marksmanship, close quarters battle, mission planning, surveillance, combat focused physical fitness and evasive driving.

Mr. Birch retired from the U.S. Army in 2007 after over thirty years' service in a variety of Special Operations units, where he participated in numerous combat missions, security, surveillance, dignitary protection and other sensitive operations. His military career culminated with service as the first Command Sergeant Major (CSM) of the U.S. Army's Asymmetric Warfare Group (AWG) where he was instrumental in establishment of a new and select military unit specifically designed to respond to the global war on terror. While at the AWG, CSM Birch continued to participate in numerous combat patrols in both Afghanistan and Iraq as a team member to better assess the unit's capabilities.

Mr. Birch's service in Special Operations Forces included both the 75th Ranger Regiment and 1st SFOD-D (Delta Force). He participated in numerous contingency missions in the Southern, Pacific, European and Central Command (SOUTHCOM, PACOM, EUCOM and CENTCOM) areas of responsibility. He served in Operation Just Cause, Operation Desert Storm, Operation Joint Endeavor, Operation Joint Guard, Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom. Repeatedly deployed into combat /hostile fire zones, he has been to more than 70 countries and participated in combat and reconnaissance/security missions in 11 different countries.

Mr. Birch has over 26 commendations to include the Distinguished Service Medal, the Silver Star, Bronze Star for Valor with an Oak Leaf Cluster, and the Purple Heart. He was nominated to the Ranger Hall of Fame in 2012.

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**Zachary Brown**  
**Associate Division Counsel**  
**FBI Kansas City Division**

Supervisory Special Agent Zachary Brown is FBI Kansas City's Associate Division Counsel. ADC Brown was previously assigned to FBI Kansas City's Health Care Fraud and Complex Financial Crimes squad. Prior to ADC Brown's assignment to the Kansas City Field Office, SA Brown served as a Special Agent in FBI San Antonio Division's Brownsville, Texas Resident Agency. ADC Brown has investigated complex fraud schemes, public corruption, violent crime, kidnappings for ransom, and organized crime. In addition to his investigative duties, ADC Brown has served as Crisis and Hostage Negotiator on FBI's Crisis Negotiation Team. Before joining the FBI, ADC Brown practiced law, specializing in criminal litigation.

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**Erin Cozad Curtis**  
**Chief Division Counsel**  
**FBI Kansas City Division**

Supervisory Special Agent Erin Cozad Curtis is FBI Kansas City's Chief Division Counsel and previously served as the Associate Division Counsel since 2017. Prior to her arrival in KC, she served for eight years as a Special Agent with FBI Springfield Division, stationed in the Fairview Heights, Illinois Resident Agency. She has worked white collar, health care fraud, violent crime, civil rights, counterterrorism and cyber investigations. Specialized areas of practice for CDC Curtis include Criminal Law and Constitutional Law.

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**Josh Hunt**  
**Director**  
**MEDWAY Drug Enforcement Agency**

Joshua Hunt started his career in law enforcement in 1997. In his current position with the MEDWAY Drug Enforcement Agency, he oversees the Agency as the Director. The Agency conducts covert drug investigations at the Local, State and Federal level. His career has consisted of work in Corrections, Patrol Division, School Resource Officer, Detective, Field Training Officer, SWAT Team Member, Technical Surveillance Agent and Senior Agent, prior to being selected as the Director in 2023. He is a graduate of the 293<sup>rd</sup> session of the F.B.I. National Academy and holds an Associates of Applied Science in Criminal Justice, Summa Cum Laude. He is a certified A.L.I.C.E instructor; National Drug Endangered Children Approach Instructor, Force Science Institute De-Escalation Instructor, in addition he has previously been certified by the Ohio Peace Officers Training Commission as a general academy instructor. He has received certification in Forensic Child Interview, Clandestine Laboratory Hazardous

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Waste Operator (level A & B), Advanced Reid Interview and Interrogations, Evidence Technician, Crisis Intervention Officer and multiple narcotics investigation courses. Director Hunt's team has been responsible for cleaning hundreds of methamphetamine clandestine labs.

Director Hunt, along with the MEDWAY staff, were the 2018 Ohio NARCO Agency of the Year recipient for their role in a two year, OCEDTF, Federal investigation, "Scarlet Rider," in which over seventeen kilos of cocaine, three and a half kilos of crystal methamphetamine, seventeen guns and over five hundred and fifty thousand dollars were seized. Director Hunt was recognized as an "Expert Witness" in the area of narcotics for the Northern District of Ohio, Federal Court.

Director Hunt received the Wayne County Children Services "2008 Officer of the Year" award for his investigation of a child homicide at the hands of a drug addicted man who was the boyfriend of the child's mother and has been nominated on multiple other occasions.

Director Hunt is a long-time member of the Orrville Turning Point Coalition, which is coalition comprised of law enforcement, treatment professionals, health care professionals, school personnel, and community members who share a common goal in the prevention of youth substance abuse. He is also an instructor for the Wayne County Pregnancy Care Center's "Peer to Peer" program which travels to local high schools and teaches the consequences choices have on their lives.

Director Hunt is the current Secretary for the Ohio Task Force Commanders Association. He sits on the Partnership for Wayne and Holmes County Harm Reduction Committee as well as the Overdose Fatality review board.

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**Sean McCarthy**  
**Continuing Education Coordinator**  
**St. Louis Metropolitan Police Academy**

Sean McCarthy has served as Continuing Education Coordinator since 2005 for the St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department. In addition to teaching many courses he designed, he supervises lesson plan construction and coordinates delivery of training for the St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department's 1,900 employees. He has guided the department through two POST audits, and taken part in the CALEA accreditation process.

During his tenure with the department, Sean has worked to improve the quality of internal training by moving toward a more rigorous, collegiate curriculum. Subjects taught include: Critical Thinking, Study Skills, Strategic Planning, Best Practices, Non-Biased Policing, Public Speaking, Ethics, Leadership, Basic Supervision, Management Theory, and Promotional Test Preparation, among others.

Sean is a graduate of Instructor Development School, and holds a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science from St. Louis University.

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**Michael Werges**  
**Chief**  
**Eureka Police Department**

Chief Michael Werges has been a Missouri Peace Officer for over 27 years and is the current Chief of Police for the City of Eureka. He has led transformative initiatives in officer wellness, high-risk employee supervision, and internal cultural change. He serves as a regional leader and public speaker on wellness integration and personnel leadership, having presented at conferences and academic institutions. He currently instructs through the Missouri Police Chiefs Command College and holds leadership roles in multiple professional associations. He has extensive experience managing crisis response teams, leading the development of wellness policies, and directly mentoring officers in both recovery and performance improvement settings.

Chief Werges earned a Master of Arts degree in Sociology/Criminology from Lincoln University, a Bachelor's Degree in Sociology from Missouri State University, and is a proud graduate of the FBI National Academy, Session 283.

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Brian Zinanni
Missouri State Director, Supporting Heroes, Inc.
PSOB Benefits Coordinator, The Backstoppers

Brian Zinanni was born and raised in the Sterling-Rock Falls area of Illinois, serving nearly 17 years as a Paramedic with Twin City Ambulance/CGH Emergency Services as well as a Paid On-Call Firefighter with Rock Falls Fire Department. In addition, he served the county as a Deputy Coroner and worked with the McDonald Funeral Home. Mr. Zinanni related to the St. Louis region to accept a career Firefighter-Paramedic position with the City of Clayton Fire Department, serving for 20 years prior to retiring as Lieutenant Medical Officer in May 2022.

During his time in St. Louis, Mr. Zinanni achieved an associate degree in Paramedic Technology, associate degree in Mortuary Science, and a bachelor's degree in Emergency Management.

In 2004, Mr. Zinanni founded and launched what would become the Missouri Fire Service Funeral Assistance Team. This team helps coordinate and provide professional honors to members of the Fire Service. Shortly after, he was named the Missouri representative to the National Fallen Firefighters Foundation Local Assistance State Team. It is through that appointment that he developed a unique skillset, navigating the Federal Public Safety Officer Benefit (PSOB) process. Mr. Zinanni has had the honor of assisting many families in filing for and achieving this benefit. He was selected to travel to Washington, DC to beta test the new PSOB 2.0 electronic submission platform. To date, he has filed over 90 claims in the new system for both death and disability benefits. He has also had the pleasure of teaching on the topic of line of duty death across the U.S. and has served as a resource to state and local agencies in development of policy and guidelines that assist in ensuring their public safety officers have maximum ability to receive benefits in the event of a tragedy.

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In 2016, Mr. Zinanni assisted with the expansion of Supporting Heroes to serve the State of Missouri. Supporting Heroes, like The Backstoppers, is a charity that supports the families of fallen public safety officers in Kentucky, Indiana and Missouri. Serving as the Missouri State Director, his duties include response to line of duty death of all public safety officers in the state, filing for and achieving benefits for those families, and coordinating survivor support events and travel to their respective National Memorial. Additional responsibilities include seeking fundraising opportunities and soliciting memberships to support the cause. Mr. Zinanni's duties have also expanded to serve the organization as the survivor outreach coordinator for all survivors in the three states they serve. He also has the honor of serving as an independent contractor for PSOB consulting services with The Backstoppers.

It is through his work with Supporting Heroes that Mr. Zinanni developed a more in-depth working relationship with other public safety disciplines, fostering amazing relationships with the Missouri Law Enforcement Funeral Assistance Team and the Missouri Concerns of Police Survivors. He has presented at several law enforcement agencies and law enforcement/corrections conferences.

In December 2020, Mr. Zinanni was offered and accepted the position of Fire Chief for the Twin City Joint Fire Command in Sterling & Rock Falls, Illinois (his hometown). After further reflection, and following principles of author and inspirational speaker Simon Sinek, he decided to follow his "why" and remain in Missouri to continue serving the families of our fallen public safety officers.

Mr. Zinanni is currently a board of director for the Fire Fighters Memorial Foundation of Missouri, the organization that oversees the Firefighters Memorial in Kingdom City, MO. He is also a board of director for the Fire Fighter Historical Preservation and Education Center, the organization that will oversee the future Firefighters Museum adjacent to the memorial in Kingdom City.
